ADAMH Consumer Outcomes



OUR MISSION: We exist to improve the well being of our community by reducing the incidence of mental health problems and the abuse of alcohol and other drugs.

Changes to ADAMH Consumer Outcomes System

- SHARES is going live for Outcomes on January 1, 2016
- Aligning with the Council of Governments (COG) (i.e., Hamilton, Cuyahoga, and Franklin Counties)
- **Changes are required beginning 4/1/2016**
 - However, if able, providers may begin implementing these changes 1/1/2016
 - Current outcome forms must be used up to and including 12/31/2015
 - **Exception: Outcomes data submissions are expected beginning 7/1/2016**

(Updated 3/28/2016)

Outcome Tools (AOD Adults)

- AOD Adults
 - Brief Addiction Monitor (BAM)
 - Replacing the Addiction Severity Index (ASI)
 - ASI forms may be used to fulfill submission requirements up to and including March 31, 2016
 - No longer using ‘Initial’ and ‘Follow-Up’ forms
 - Same form administered at both points
 - Scales: Use, Risk Factors, Protective Factors

Brief Addiction Monitor

- Required for
 - Adult consumers (age 18 or older at time of administration)
 - Receiving qualifying AOD treatment services

- AD Family Counseling
- AD GROUP COUNSELING
- AD INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING
- CASE MANAGEMENT
- Integr Dual Diag Comm Tx TeamSpts
- INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT
- METHADONE ADMINISTRATION
- Suboxone Admin

Outcome Tools (MH Adults)

- MH Adults
 - Ohio Scales for Adults (formerly known as Adult Consumer Form A)
 - Changes to the form: Fewer questions, Response options
 - Scales: Quality of Life (incl. subscales Housing QOL, Financial QOL), Empowerment, Symptom Distress, Social Connectedness

Ohio Scales for Adults

- Required for
 - Adult consumers (age 18 or older at time of administration)
 - Receiving qualifying MH treatment services

Qualifying MH Services (Adults)

- PHARMACOLOGIC MANAGMENT
- MH GROUP COUNSELING
- MH INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING
- CPST - GROUP
- CPST - INDIVIDUAL
- PARTIAL HOSPITALIZATION
- Supported Employment

Outcome Tools (MH Youths)

- MH Youths
 - Ohio Scales for Youth-Parent Form
 - Youth-Youth and Youth-Worker Forms not accepted
 - These forms may be used to fulfill submission requirements up to and including March 31, 2016
 - Changes to the form: Response options, Question text
 - Scales: Problem Severity, Hope, Satisfaction, Functioning

Ohio Scales for Youth-Parent

- Required for
 - Youth consumers (age 5-17 at time of administration)
 - Outcomes are not expected for youths under 5 years
 - Receiving qualifying MH treatment services

Qualifying MH Services (Youth)

- PHARMACOLOGIC MANAGMENT
- MH GROUP COUNSELING
- MH INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING
- CPST - GROUP
- CPST - INDIVIDUAL
- PARTIAL HOSPITALIZATION
- Supported Employment

ADAMH Outcomes

- Important to keep this in mind:
 - There may be a difference among
 - What/how often you choose to collect data (Outcome Administration)
 - What ADAMH expects you to submit (Outcome Reporting)
 - What ADAMH includes in analyses (Outcome Analysis)

Outcome Administration

- Administration frequency for all forms
 - Initial tool administration at program entry/start of services
 - Every 180 days following the most recent tool administration (or more frequently)

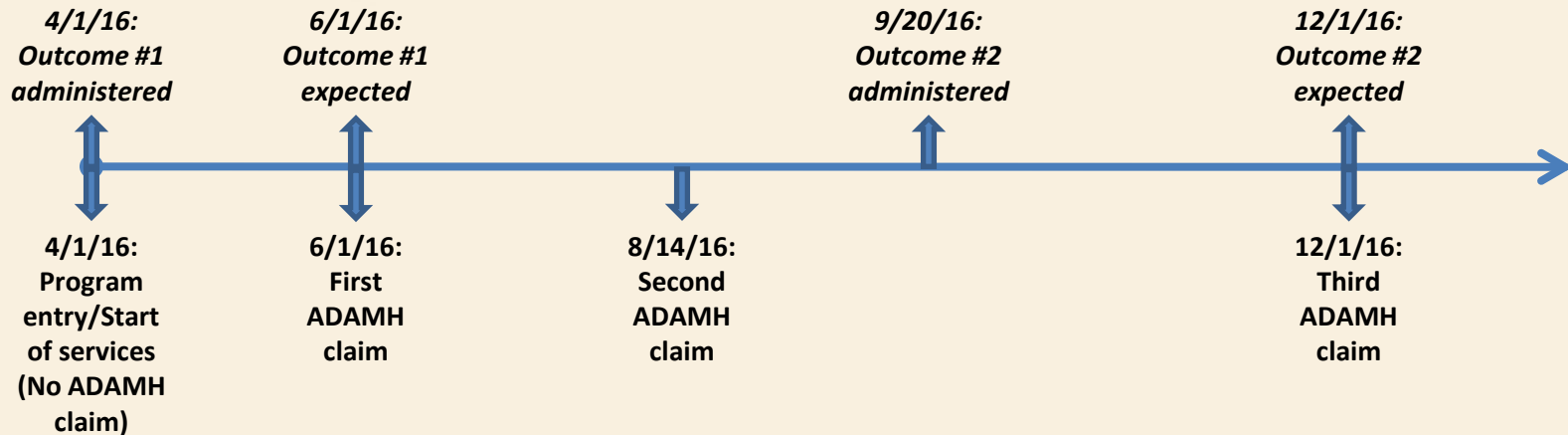
Outcomes Submissions

- Any ADAMH-paid claim for qualifying services:
 - **At least one outcome administration is expected**
- An episode of care is defined as any 2+ ADAMH-paid claims for qualifying services spanning a length of time more than 180 days, given there is no gap of 180 days between any two consecutive ADAMH claims
 - **2+ outcome administrations are expected for consumers whose ADAMH claims meet this standard**

Outcomes Expectations

- Outcomes submission expectations are based upon the dates of ADAMH claims for qualifying services
 - ADAMH counts an outcome administration that is within ± 90 days of a qualifying ADAMH claim
- Requirements for submission will be met if an outcome is administered at program entry/start of services and every 180 days (or more frequently) during program participation/duration of services

Outcomes Expectations: Example



- Two outcomes are expected for this consumer. Why?
 - Qualifying ADAMH claims over a span of time greater than 180 calendar days
 - No two consecutive ADAMH claims are separated by 180 or more days
- The outcome administrations fulfill ADAMH submission expectations. Why?
 - Outcome #1 (4/1/16) was administered within ± 90 days from the first ADAMH claim (6/1/16)
 - Outcome #2 (9/20/16) was administered within ± 90 days from the 12/1/16 claim (the ADAMH claim > 180 days after the first ADAMH claim)

Outcomes Expectations: Special Considerations

- Switching from ASIs to BAMs
 - ASIs will be accepted prior to 4/1/16
 - Either AOD outcome form will fulfill submission expectations during the transition
 - Due to the change, consumers who receive different outcomes forms over time will be excluded from change analysis

Outcomes Expectations: Special Considerations

- Switching from Youth-Youth/Youth-Worker forms to Youth-Parent
 - Youth-Youth/Youth-Worker forms will be accepted prior to 4/1/16
 - These outcome forms will fulfill submission expectations during the transition
 - Due to the change, consumers who receive different outcomes forms over time will be excluded from change analysis

Outcomes Expectations: Special Considerations

- For consumers who are unable or refuse to complete an outcome form, to fulfill outcomes expectations follow these instructions
 - Ohio Scales for Adults:
 - Record the date that the tool administration was attempted in *Date*; select 'Person refused' for *Completion Status*
 - Ohio Scales for Youth-Parent:
 - Record the date that the tool administration was attempted in *Date*; select 'Person refused' for *Completion Status*
 - Brief Addiction Monitor:
 - Record the date that the tool administration was attempted in *Date*; leave *Administration Method* blank

Outcomes Expectations: Special Considerations

- For transitional age youth, to fulfill outcomes expectations follow these instructions
 - When consumer is under 18 years of age, administer the Ohio Scales for Youth-Parent outcome form
 - When consumer is 18 years of age or older, administer the Ohio Scales for Adult outcome form

Outcomes Expectations: Special Considerations

- For emancipated youth, wards of the court/state, or youth for whom it is unreasonable to have a parent complete an outcome form, to fulfill outcomes expectations follow these instructions
 - Follow outcomes submission schedule
 - Record the date that the tool administration was attempted (or would have been administered had a parent been present) in *Date*; select 'Person refused' for *Completion Status*

Outcomes Expectations: Special Considerations

- For adult consumers of qualifying MH and AOD services:
 - Both Ohio Scales for Adults and BAM outcome submissions are expected

Outcomes Analysis

- For analysis of change, ADAMH will compare measures from these submissions:
 - Most recent outcome submission connected to a qualifying ADAMH claim (i.e., an expected outcome submission)
 - Within the same *episode of care*, whichever is most recent: Initial tool administration or First outcome submission within the previous two years
 - Note: Only outcomes that are ≥ 90 days apart will be included in the analysis

Submitting Data

- SHARES Members and Outcomes Forms
 - Walkthrough
- SHARES Batch Data Uploads
 - File specification will be provided at a later date

Submitting Data

- Switching to SHARES IDs, UCIs will not be available for ADAMH-only consumers
- Outcome forms administered on or before December 31, 2015, should be submitted using UCI as the ID#
- Outcomes forms administered on or after January 1, 2016, should be submitted using the SHARES ID as the ID#
 - Using the Access Templates? Enter the 6-digit SHARES ID followed by “0”

Submitting Data

- Method for submitting from January 1 to March 31, 2016, depends on the outcomes forms administered:
 - Using the current outcomes forms?
 - Submit your outcomes data files to files.adamhfranklin.org (the 'extranet')
 - ADAMH will convert the data and load into SHARES
 - Using the new outcomes forms?
 - Submit data using SHARES

 - Submission Reports (SHARES Data Extracts, if requested)
 - Submission Expectations Reports
 - Consumer Outcomes Reports
- Report QI Meetings
 - Outcomes Reports Users Group (Jan/Feb)
