**Outcomes Expected Received – BAM (provider report)**

*Purpose:*

This provider report shows a list of episodes of consumers who have had at least one qualifying service for BAM submissions within the past two years

*Overview:*

Comma-separated values (CSV) formatted file that presents a list of consumer episodes and includes (but is not limited to) the lengths of episodes, start and dates of episodes, number of BAM administrations, and expected number of BAM administrations. Expected number of administrations are calculated based on length of days in an episode.

*Frequency:*

Reports are produced and delivered in connection with the ADAMH claims run schedule. See the *Reimbursement Schedule* available on the Provider Portal of the ADAMH Franklin website (<https://adamhfranklin.org/provider-portal/>). Reports are delivered on or before the dates specified for “Reimbursement Expected.”

*Transmission Method:*

Reports are available for download in the SHARES File Transfer Subsystem in the Download folder.

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*Report Columns:*

1. SHARES\_Prov\_ID
  - SHARES provider ID associated with the consumer's qualifying claims
2. SHARES\_Pat\_ID
  - The SHARES member ID of the consumer
3. Last\_Name
  - The last name of the consumer
4. First\_Name
  - The first name of the consumer
5. Birthdate
  - The birthdate of the consumer
6. EpisodeOrder
  - The order of each episode  
An episode is defined as any set of qualifying services, which has at most 180 days between consecutive qualifying claims
7. EpisodeStartDate
  - The date when an episode started
8. MR\_DOS
  - The most recent date of service
9. EpisodeEndDate
  - The date when an episode ended  
An episode ends when there is a gap of more than 180 days following a qualifying claim. If the most recent date of service is over 280 days from when the report is run, then the episode is closed. (100 days are added to account for the 100-day allowance days between service/billing dates.)
10. EpisodeLengthInDays
  - The number of days between an episode's start date and its most recent date of service
11. NumBAMAdmin
  - The number of BAM administrations given between 90 days before an episode's start date and 90 days after an episode's most recent date of service
12. ExpectedNumBAM
  - The expected number of BAM administrations given between 90 days before an episode's start date and 90 days after an episode's most recent date of service  
A consumer should be administered a BAM between -90 days and +90 days from the start of an episode. After that, one should be administered every 180 days during the same episode (if the episode duration is longer than 180 days). Note that at least one form should be administered to every consumer who appears on the list.
