ADAMH Public School Investments:

Research shows that 1 in 5 youth have a diagnosable mental health disorder. Only 20% of those receive treatment. We also know that 50% of lifetime mental health disorders start by age 14. Early identification and intervention is essential for positive outcomes.

The Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health Board of Franklin County has partnered with all of the public school districts in Franklin County to provide prevention, early intervention and treatment services to students by providing funding for certified mental health and addiction providers to be available for support in each district.

Ohio Guidestone (OGS) will provide prevention services for the Whitehall City School district that are intended to promote social, emotional and academic competence. OGS will work with school personnel to identify students at risk of developing mental health disorders and/or substance use disorders. Students, parents and school personnel will be provided with access to services that will work to increase awareness and knowledge of mental health and substance use signs and symptoms, along with providing access to support. Through this partnership, ADAMH aims to reduce the incidents of mental health disorders and the onset of substance use in youth.

ADAMH is Franklin County's authority for planning, funding and evaluating mental health, alcohol and drug use prevention and treatment services. ADAMH-funded services are provided by a local network of more than 30 not-for-profit providers.
