ADAMH Public School Investments:

Research shows that 1 in 5 youth have a diagnosable mental health disorder. We also know that 50% of lifetime mental health disorders start by age 14. Early identification and intervention is essential for positive outcomes. Prevention activities work to educate and support individuals and communities to prevent the use and misuse of drugs and the development of substance use disorders. Research shows 4 out of 5 youth could benefit from prevention services.

The Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health Board of Franklin County has partnered with all public school districts in Franklin County to provide prevention and early intervention services to students by funding certified mental health and addiction providers to be available for support in each district. Through these partnerships, ADAMH aims to reduce the incidents of mental health disorders and the onset of substance use in youth.
