Re: SmartCare Update Memo #14 – July 29 Update

This memo provides guidance regarding the ADAMH Procedure Code Taxonomy and a temporary process for rendering provider and licensure data in SmartCare.

ADAMH Procedure Code Taxonomy

The ADAMH Board of Franklin County maintains a Procedure Code Taxonomy (PCT) as a resource for provider billing staff to reference when preparing claims for submission through SmartCare. The PCT is found on the ADAMH Provider Portal (<https://adamhfranklin.org/provider-portal/>) in the SmartCare section and is updated on an as needed basis.

In the PCT, providers can review the full list of procedure codes, modifiers and unit rates for each service currently payable by ADAMH. The PCT also illustrates differential rates for certain procedure codes based upon the credential of the rendering provider, whether a service is covered under the Crisis benefit plan, whether a rendering provider is required with a claim and other useful information.

Rendering Provider and Licensure Data in SmartCare

In order to adjudicate claims for specific services at differential rates based on licensure level, the ADAMH Board has configured SmartCare to use rendering provider and licensure records in the system. The Board utilizes the Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM) 84/95 report in order to update these records on a bi-weekly basis to ensure claims submitted by providers are adjudicated at the appropriate rate.

The ADAMH Board has been made aware that ODM will temporarily be holding rendering provider enrollment applications from August 1 through October 1, 2022, as the state agency transitions to the new Provider Network Management (PNM) module and completes data conversion. We anticipate that due to the temporary hold the 84/95 data reports will also not be updated from August 31 through October 1, 2022 and ADAMH will not have a primary data source for updating records in SmartCare.

Since ADAMH will not have data from the ODM 84/95 report to add new or update existing rendering provider records during this period of time, the Board will be offering providers a simple template method to provide updated rendering provider data in the interim that is needed in order to maintain updated licensure data. The Claims and Enrollment team will be providing further guidance directly to provider billing leads on how to submit rendering provider data directly to ADAMH during the 84/95 report downtime before August 31.
