Re: SmartCare Update Memo #9 – May 20 Update

This memo provides guidance regarding the updated Procedure Code Taxonomy on the ADAMH Provider Portal website as well as guidance regarding the use of Lab Urinalysis procedure codes.

Procedure Code Taxonomy Update

ADAMH maintains the Procedure Code Taxonomy (PCT) of behavioral health services identified as payable procedure codes in the SmartCare system. This resource can be found on the ADAMH Provider Portal under the SmartCare section at <https://adamhfranklin.org/provider-portal/#SmartCare> and is a valuable resource for provider claims and billing activities. The PCT is updated on annually and as changes are required; the most recent version posted to the website is current as of May 13.

The PCT workbook consists of several spreadsheets with information on allowed procedure code definitions, unit definition and standard rates for each code, allowed and required modifiers, allowed add-on code combinations, a dictionary of allowed modifiers and place of service (POS) codes, and time conversion tables for billing.

Lab Urinalysis Procedure Codes (H0048 and H0003)

Provider agencies authorized to submit claims to ADAMH for the collection and analysis of urine samples for the presence of substances utilize two related procedure codes – H0048 Urine Drug Screening and H0003 Urinalysis - Lab Analysis. All providers with the H0048 code in their KY22 budget as a billable service now have the H0003 code set up in their rate schedule in SmartCare for claims submission.

The H0048 code is utilized to identify the administration and collection of the sample and H0003 is utilized for the cost of lab analysis for clients who are not Medicaid eligible. Providers should submit claims for both procedure codes at the same time and include the rendering provider in order to capture the activity when services are rendered to non-Medicaid eligible individuals. Lab analysis services completed for Medicaid eligible individuals should be submitted to the appropriate lab vendor in accordance with Ohio Department of Medicaid procedures. Both H0048 and H0003 will correctly deny in SmartCare for the “third party fully responsible” reason if the individual is Medicaid eligible.
