



# In 2023, ADAMH invested more than \$23.6 million in prevention.





- 8.76% adults ages 18 and older have a substance use disorder, and of these 86% reported that they did not receive treatment.
- 22.28% of adults report they have a mental illness, with just 17.91% reporting that they have received services.
- Young adults experience mental health illness and substance use issues at a higher rate than their older counterparts (26+).




### What don't we know?

We do not fully understand the root causes, biology, risk, or protective factors to explain "who", "why", "how" and "when" of mental illness



# Why Ohio?

Ohio is at the center of the opioid addiction and mental health crises, witnessing some of the highest rates of overdose and suicide deaths in the country.

### We must know.

Because mental illness remains largely a mystery, we continue to see increasing rates of deaths of despair both nationwide (427 per day) and in Ohio (19 per day).






FIGURE 1. Age-adjusted death rates\* for total cardiovascular disease, diseases of the heart, coronary heart disease, and stroke,<sup>†</sup> by year — United States, 1900-1996








# **SOAR** Response Rates by Ohio Regions


#### **SOAR Cluster Response To date**

- Grouped into 15 clusters (Regions)
- 12.028 responses, across all 88 counties
- 61% want to participate again
- Good response rates from all clusters!





# **SOAR Emergent Resilience and the Brain**

#### **Cognitive Control Network (CCN) and Salience & Emotion Network (SEN) Connectivity**


- 154 adults with history of mood disorders
  - Higher childhood trauma and *lower* functioning associated with greater within-SEN connectivity •
  - Higher childhood trauma and *higher* functioning (emergent resilience) associated with greater within-CCN • connectivity




Interventions targeting **cognitive control** may be particularly helpful in fostering **emergent resilience** 

(e.g., cognitive processing therapy, trauma-focused CBT, cognitive control training)


